WEEE - Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment - Regulations



The aim of the European WEEE Regulation:-

- Reduce EEE waste.
- Encourage re-use, recovery and recycling by setting targets for various categories of WEEE.
- Make Producers responsible for the products they manufacture, hire or import.
- All EEE to be marked with a 'crossed out wheelie bin' symbol.
- Establish and maintain a register of EEE Producers.
- Separately collected WEEE must be treated.
- Make Distributors responsible for taking back WEEE free of charge.

PPM is part of an approved compliance scheme and is registered with the UK Environment Agency. Our producer registration number is WEE/FA0509VR

PPM's instruments are designed for professional use and accordingly they are classified as b2b (business to business). We offer our UK customers a "take back" service for redundant instruments produced from 2006 onwards and properly dispose of them free of charge. Instruments for disposal must be returned using prepaid carriage with an accompanying decontamination certificate.

As a voluntary service to our customers we also "take back" instruments manufactured before 2006 free of charge, if a new replacement instrument is purchased.

In other cases we reserve the right, to charge a cost-covering disposal fee.
